### **First Press Conference of Orthodox Bishops attending the Lambeth Conference 2022**

In the GSFA Press Release of July 7, we set out the **Four Priorities of GSFA** (see below) related to the conference, adding that at this press conference, media will be advised how we shall seek to fulfil them – including a **re-affirmation of Lambeth 1.10**.

On arrival, journalist shall be provided with a paper copy of the press release and will be emailed an electronic version at 1045am.

Archbishop Badi, and one other primate will be **available for interview** at the end, for a maximum of 15 minutes per interview. Bids to be sent to Paul Eddy who will confirm nearer the date.

NB. **The GSFA/EFAC (see below) Resource Group** will seek to meet the reasonable requests of all accredited press over the course of the conference. If we cannot help with a specific request, at specific time, we will do our best to arrange a one-to-one at another time, or a phone interview with Revd Paul Eddy, the official spokesperson for Archbishop Badi and GSFA for the Lambeth Conference.

- **Foster the Unity of the Orthodox, whilst being a faithful witness, and defender of ‘the faith once delivered’**
- **Sound a ‘Clarion Call’ to Biblical Faithfulness, including seeking the ‘re-affirmation of Lambeth 1.10’\* as the ‘official teaching’ of the Anglican Church on marriage and sexuality**
- **Stand by GSFA’s principle of not being a ‘breakaway group’ from the Anglican Communion.** *(GSFA sees itself, and seeks to be part of, the ‘holy remnant’ that God has preserved in the Anglican Communion), and to*
- **Spur on the faithful in the Communion to get the Gospel out into the world, earnestly defending the purity of the faith in order that it might be propagated to a lost and needy world**
